

Biographies

Robin Ward

is the first New Zealander to complete post graduate studies in historical harp performance, focusing on the Triple-strung harp at Victoria University's School of Music. Robin has successfully completed both a BMus (Honours, 1st class) and a MMus in Baroque Harp Performance under the guidance of early music specialists Euan Murdoch and Douglas Mews.

Prior to his studies on the baroque harp, Robin's initial harp training was on the pedal or orchestral harp, culminating in the completion of a BMus degree in Pedal Harp Performance. Over the course of completing his studies on the pedal harp, Robin has worked with various regional orchestras, and has also held the position of Principal harpist for the New Zealand National Youth Orchestra in 2000 and 2001.

During the course of his studies Robin has established himself as a teacher of lever, pedal and early harps, and as a freelance harpist performing in a number of varying environments both as a soloist and as a member of various ensembles.

Derek Holland

is the musical director. He studied Music and English at London University and is a primary school teacher. He is also an organist at Cores End URC in Bucks. Derek is the director of the Borehamwood Brass Band and Waltham St Lawrence Silver Band in Berks. He is also Musical Director of Uxbridge Music Theatre and has extensive experience in conducting light opera.

Joanna Raworth

(Soprano) Has been singing for eight years under the tuition of Jennifer Lilleystone. She is currently a member of two musical societies Southgate Opera (SOpera) & The Chapel End Savoy Players (CESP), currently sings as part of the chorus for both societies and has been successful in playing the parts of Rose Maybud from Gilbert & Sullivan's Ruddigore (May 2008) with CESP, O'Mimosa San from Sidney Jones' The Geisha (Feb 2009) with Opera & Viola from James Albery & Albert Cellier's The Spectre Knight (Aug 2009) with CESP which went to Buxton for the Gilbert & Sullivan Festival. Her next role will be with Southgate Opera in February 2010 where she will play the part of Ruth in Gilbert & Sullivan's The Pirates of Penzance. "I'm most excited to be performing for you all tonight and hope you will enjoy the evening."

Samantha Rice

(Mezzo Soprano) is a primary school teacher at Summerswood Primary School (Borehamwood). She has extensive choral and solo singing experience and has her Grade 8 in voice from ABRSM. Samantha plays solo tenor horn with, and is Secretary of, Borehamwood Brass. She has also played with Enfield Brass Band and recently performed in the Royal Festival Hall.
